

10th Annual Project Life Golf Tournament Recap

On a beautiful Spring Day in April, over 100 golfers gathered at Franklin Bridge Golf club to participate in the 10th annual Project Life Golf Tournament. This is a major fund-raising event that supports the work of Project Life and Helping Hands.

Project Life brings hope, education and options to women experiencing unexpected pregnancy to save the lives of pre-born children. This is accomplished primarily by mobile units that offer free ultrasounds and Christian counseling to women who are considering abortion, so they can see an image of the pre-born child and then choose to keep them or give them up for adoption. Helping Hands supports children entering foster care with new, large duffle bags for their belongings. Tennessee Action Council has no paid staff and accomplishes all their work through the efforts of volunteers within the divisions of Project life and Helping Hands.

This year's keynote address was delivered by Kim Lewis, Executive Director at Bartow Family Resources located in Cartersville, GA. Kim and the staff at Bartow partner with Tennessee Action Council to deliver services to

women and families in north Georgia using a Project Life mobile unit. Bartow staffs the services, offering both clinical care and Christian counseling. Kim shared several touching stories about women and pre-born

children who have been impacted by their mobile service. One of the stories was about a woman who took an abortion pill, then began having second thoughts and came to the mobile unit for help. Using an abortion pill reversal

protocol (APR), the clinical staff and medical director at Bartow were able help the mom continue her pregnancy and, as a result, a beautiful healthy baby girl was born just a few days after the tournament.

In addition to having beautiful weather, a great course to play, and an incredibly meaningful purpose, the day offered some wonderful excitement with 4 teams tying for first place with the winner decided in a shootout.
